Awards — applications are now closed for 2013

In 2012, a review of the awards application processes, identified it was important to applicants that the process be 'clear and easy', 'fair and consistent' and 'timely'. Based on this feedback we have streamlined our processes and introduced an online application and selection processes – all with no major glitches or technology related grief! This will enable us to bring the whole awards programme forward in 2014 and provide the grants in a more timely way. Awards will be open from 1 February to 31 March in 2014, with the awards ceremonies being held in July instead of September.

To date we have received an increase in the number of applications for all awards, particularly the second chance education awards and research awards. We attribute this increase to an increase in demand and need for education and research, along with extensive promotion of the awards –along with the 'clear and easy' online application process.

New Second Chance Awards

We welcome the following new sponsors who have each sponsored a second chance award for 2013.

Research Report

- Rose Ryan of Heathrose Research 2012 Janus 1995 NGO Research Award
- The Social (not-for) Profit Sector and Women an exploratory study
- We have very little information in Aotearoa New Zealand about women's participation in our country's Social (Not-for) Profit Sector leadership, aside from anecdotal evidence. This is despite this sector of our voluntary and paid work-force being heavily dominated by women.
- We have now completed a phone survey with people from 49 not-for-profit organisations. This asked about the gender and ethnic mix of paid staff, volunteers, and leadership and governance structures for the organisation.
- The organisations are a mix of national, regional and local organisations, with most from the social services sector. Over the next month we will be analysing and writing up the findings of the exploratory study. This will be used to both inform the sector and to provide the basis for a wider survey of organisations in the Social Profit Sector. We aim for the exploratory study report to be completed in May 2013.

Research Study - Family Violence and the Evangelical Church

Daphne Marsden was the recipient of the 2012 Society for Research on Women (SROW) Award.

Daphne's thesis will explore Christian women's experience of domestic violence.

Canadian Sociologist Nason Clark claims sometimes, instead of being strongly encouraged to leave the abusive context, a Christian woman is presented with a myriad of reasons why she should stay. She is told of her responsibility to remain and to behave in ways which will discourage or prevent violence towards her. She is often expected to adapt and cater to the violence directed at her. Such advice is theologised and framed in some evangelical biblical teaching such as the elevation of a hierarchical pattern in family being ordained by God, or by encouraging women to forgive seventy times seven, or by attributing value to suffering as Christians.

In addition, modelling and teaching within church communities often promotes values which attribute greater worth and entitlement for males and husbands. When looking to the church for help, women in such situations often tell of experiencing minimisation, blame, an expectation that they will return home, behave differently, be forgiving, exercise patience, prayer and so on.

This study will explore the issues Christian women face as they suffer abuse at the hands of a spouse and seek assistance and guidance from their church communities. It will present the view that those responses by Christian communities, especially leaders, to spousal abuse suffered by their women are, for the most part limited and inadequate, and that as a result the prevention of violence within Christian families is neglected.

Recent correspondence with Daphne states 'My Masters research is going so well, I have submitted a draft this last week to my supervisors and it is looking like I will be able to submit a final version in the next month. I have made use of the New Horizons \$ by getting someone to help with the laying out and footnoting, checking sources etc. She has also helped with assisting me to get right the little bit of Hebrew and Greek I needed to include. One of my supervisors has helped me to use a good amount of the Women's Narrative which I collected so there really is a resounding voice from the women I interviewed. I am so pleased with how it is looking.

It means a lot that a women's organisation such as New Horizons was willing to back me and know that they are so behind giving voice to women.

Progress Reports

Awardees are expected to submit a progress report to the Trust in the year they receive their award. This is then forwarded to their sponsor. I would like to share with you an excerpt from one such report I received this year that I feel 'says it all' about women striving for a better life for themselves and their families.

Studying full-time as a mature student with four young children has been a real challenge, and at times I question the amount of effort I put into my studies, hoping not to neglect my other commitments in the church and most importantly to my children. However, the reward of getting through each year gives my family and me amazing confidence and strength to continue to the end of my degree in order to strive for a better standard of life, and a more prosperous future.

I wish you all the best in the differences that you are making in others' lives in coming up with ways to support women such as myself who feel the minority in society.

Sponsor Spotlight: Barbara Wood Second Chance Award

Barbara Wood Memorial Foundation - The Foundation was established to commemorate the life and work of the late Barbara Wood MBE, the Dominion President of the NZ Federation of Country Women's Institutes 1970-1974, the South Pacific Area Vice-President of the Associated Country Women of the World (ACWW) from 1975 - 1977 and the Deputy World President of the same organisation between 1977-1979. Mrs Wood died tragically in the Mt Erebus air disaster.

The NZ Federation of Women's Institutes has sponsored the **Barbara Wood Second Chance Award** annually since 2008. The recipient can live anywhere in NZ and is presented their award by a member of the organisation at the

awards ceremony in September each year.

NHWT is appreciative of the opportunity to be part of an award in memory of a woman who did so much to improve the lives of NZ women.

We also enjoy meeting the members of the federation who join us at NHWT events. I believe this is an example of how our partner organisations and NHWT can work together to fulfil both our aims.
