# Looking to the past to improve the future

#### Iho – a Cord Between Two Worlds

**Kelly Tikao** - Ria McBride Research Award 2011. Master of Science Communication, Otago University.

The aims of Iho (umbilical cord) - a Cord Between Two Worlds research/film project - is to document traditional Maori birthing practices and explore how they could be integrated into a modern medical model of maternity care.

Kelly's research indicates that spiritual and practical aspects of traditional Maori birthing practices led to good outcomes for infant and maternal health and for the wellbeing of the whanau. A key question Kelly would like to answer is, "Could the adoption of some traditional Maori birthing practices play a positive role in the wellbeing of whanau and pepi (baby), today?" With five children of her own, Kelly (Waitaha, Kāti Mamoe, Kāi Tahui), has a deeply personal interest in her research. She emphasises that traditional practices are there for everyone – to take up what feels right for them.

Kelly's documented her project in a 25-minute film. She is now completing the research for her Master of Science Communication thesis at Otago University.

### Sponsor Spotlight: New Zealand Federation Graduate Women (Wellington Branch)

The hire of academic regalia by NZFGW (Wellington Branch) is a win, win situation. Students need to hire regalia and the money raised supports education and research. Over the past 20 years NZFGW(Wellington Branch) Charitable Trust has given NHWT \$133,800 initially fundraising for the NHWT Endowment fund, then funding 36 Second Chance Education Awards, 12 Research Awards, and contributing to three Sonja Davies Peace Awards. Research topics, which must be research that benefits NZ women and girls have ranged from the lives of women rest home residents to physical activity among New Zealand's Muslim women. Awards sponsored by Graduate Women Wellington have benefited women across New Zealand. Only 35% of the award funding went to Wellington or Wellington region women.

A truly great effort and New Horizons for Women appreciate all the time, effort and sponsorship NZFGW provide.
