Past awardees provide feedback on the progress they have made with their studies and research, and tell us how the awards were of use to them. Here are some excerpts from the 2018 awardees progress reports:

"I would like to thank you for the opportunity to be able to gain an award. It has not only been the monetary aspect, but also has given me a new look on life. Especially in my industry that I have chosen being a male dominated industry, the award has shown me that women can do great things in this world. When I graduate I would love to join Graduate Women NZ"

"There were a lot of ups and downs this year! However, I have persevered to produce some very exciting results. I have successfully managed to inhibit the growth of human ovarian cancer cells! The project turned out to be larger than anticipated and take longer, so the money from the award enabled me to put the extra time into the project without having to worry about the time and money needed to extend the project"

"As a mature student 45+ I had exceeded my allocated study weeks and no longer qualified for student allowance. The Award from NHWT was received with open arms as it gave a glimmer of hope and belief that I have been recognised for my efforts, as well as reducing some bills and keeping the wolf from the door. Thank you"

"Receiving this scholarship gave me not only a monetary boost but a confidence boost. It is the first time in a long time that I have had some one believe in me. I have worked very hard my whole life and have never received any recognition for it, so to receive this was spiritually empowering"

"My plan next year is to establish myself in my midwifery practice working with predominantly Maori women and whanau; gaining more confidence in the profession and continuing to have fun always".

#### Rae Julian

Rae along with Rosemary Barrington established the Sonja Davies Peace Award in 2002, with the first award in 2004. Following Sonja's death in 2005, administration of the award was passed to the New Horizons for Women Trust.

Rae was a secondary schoolteacher. She went on to early childhood research, then to the Labour Research Unit in Parliament. She was a Human Rights Commissioner with special responsibility for women's rights; worked as part of the UN Mission to Cambodia for a year; and was VSA field manager in Cambodia, Vietnam and Laos. Rae was also a Canada Fund Co-ordinator in the Pacific and Executive Director for the



Council for International Development. She has participated in a number of voluntary organisations, notably the Society for Research on Women, the UN Women National Committee, the Women's Electoral Lobby, the Council for Equal Pay and Opportunity and the Women's Studies Association.

#### About Sonja Davies 1923-2005

Sonja was a nurse, a committed women's rights and labour activist, a politician, and peace campaigner. Sonja helped to found the Working Women's Council, and in 1974 she became the first female executive of the Federation of Labour.

Her profile was elevated when her autobiography *Bread and Roses*, was made into a movie by Gaylene Preston. The title of Sonja's book is taken from the song *Bread and Roses* (James Oppenheim 1911) and received a new lease of life with the resurgence of the women's movement in the late 1960s and the interest in the role played by women in trade union history (www.teara.govt.nz).
